

#### PPSREA Awards \$30,000 in Scholarships to Philadelphia Graduates

Each year the PPSREA budget includes a line item for scholarships. The 2024 budget was particularly generous in this regard, having allocated an unprecedented \$30,000 in scholarships to be awarded to outstanding graduates of the Philadelphia public high schools. The work of the Scholarship Committee began shortly after the New Year, with a series of meetings that determined the number and amounts of the scholarships, the criteria, selection protocols, and timelines. Wishing to do the greatest good possible for the greatest number of students, the committee decided that the sum should be distributed among six (6) students in the amount of \$5,000 each. In late February all Philadelphia high school counselors received an email announcing the scholarship opportunity, whose deadline was April 10, 2024.

The committee met on May 8, 2024 to discuss the students' applications and choose the recipients. Using the protocol they had agreed upon prior to the meeting, the members reached consensus and identified the winners, who are named below along with the high schools from which they graduated and the colleges and universities which they will attend.

#### Wellness, Fitness and Safety

The Wellness committee hosted a CPR 101 class on Feb. 6, 2024 at Tiffany's on the Boulevard. The session was led by Jack Creighton, retired HPE teacher, coach and AD, Lurline Jones, retired HPE teacher, coach and AD and Bettyann Creighton. Attendees practiced the skills and techniques needed to save lives threatened by cardiac arrest and choking.

The skills included hands-only CPR, which does not include mouth to mouth breathing and abdominal thrusts for choking (formerly called the Heimlich maneuver). First Aid for choking now includes back blows along with the abdominal thrusts.

# Five steps to remember when helping someone in distress are:

- 1. Check the area for safety. Is it safe for you and the victim to proceed where you are?
- 2. Check for responsiveness. Is the person sleeping or unconscious? Tap and ask them if they can hear you. If the person can not respond or is having difficulty or not breathing, call 911 for help.
- 3. Place the person on their back on a firm surface.
- 4. Apply chest compressions, Put the heel of one hand in the center of the person's chest with the other hand on top.
- 5. Push hard and fast at 100-120 beats per minute. The song, 'Stayin' Alive' is the right beat.

Everyone participated and practiced using mannikins for CPR and partners and baby mannikins for choking techniques.

#### Chair Yoga

On March 14, a group of 18 members practiced an hour of chair Yoga, taught by Yoga guru and retired HPE teacher from Meredith Elem, Christopher "Theo" Theodore. Theo wrote the Yoga curriculum for the SDP PE program. Theo took us through 3-step breathing, basic stretches and relaxation exercises.

Chair Yoga is low impact and increases flexibility and movement.

Exercises Good for the Bones (courtesy of AARP)

Beginning in our 30's, we lose about 1% of our bone density a year. But weight bearing exercise (see below) will help keep your bones healthy and strong.

Wall push ups; Stand an arms length away from the wall, feet apart and straighten and bend arms 3-5 times, rest and repeat. Squats; Hold on to a chair or counter. Squat down, but don't let your butt go below your knees. Slight bend is ok! Repeat 8-10 times. Walk and stomp; Bones are stimulated when they're jolted! While walking, stomp like you are crushing a can 2 or 3 times every 10 steps. Stair climbing; *very beneficial*. Strengthens the leg and hip muscles. Add a stomp once in a while.

Hip leg lifts; Stand next to the counter top and lift your straight leg in front of you about 6 inches. Do a set of 8 to 10 lifts then switch legs. These 5 exercises will help keep you, and your bones, strong for life. Hope to see you at our Fall events,
